Just the facts

I am out of the office this week. So, the next few WPN's will be no-frills, no muss - no fuss. However, I will do my best to keep you informed from a remote location.

First hollow stem (FHS) continues to progress in our plots throughout the state. Gary Strickland reported some movement in early varieties like Jagger in October-sown wheat near Altus. Curtis Bensch observed slight movement in Fannin at Goodwell, but we are still a few days out from FHS at that location.

Several of our varieties at Stillwater and El Reno reached FHS this past week (Table 1). Remember that a variety is at the FHS stage when 1.5 cm of hollow stem is observed. A variety that has a '-' in place of numbers means that it reached FHS prior to this last sampling date.
